Since then, Bauer has litigated many notable cases. "I was on the team for the light cigarettes class action suit against Phillip Morris in Madison County and worked on the appeals that sprung from its outcome. I've defended many cases against pharmaceutical and medical device companies. Most recently, I've been representing Johnson & Johnson entities as their local counsel in trials

regarding talcum powder."

Bauer lives in Maryville with her husband and three daughters, but grew up on a farm near Raymond, Ill. Her interest in law was sparked in high school by her Sunday School teacher.

"John Coady was a judge in Christian County," she says. "He'd propose fact patterns to the class and we would discuss our thoughts about the issues and how we would decide them. Those discussions intrigued me and steered me toward an interest in the law."

Bauer attended Washington University in St. Louis, earning a dual-major degree in English literature and secondary education. Upon graduation, she applied to and was accepted by Saint Louis University School of Law, where she obtained a J.D., cum laude.

HeplerBroom traces its roots back to 1894. The firm's main office is in Edwardsville, but it maintains locations in Chicago, Springfield and Crystal Lake, Ill., St. Louis, Mo., and Hammond, Ind.
